
Discover Bucharest-Ilfov Region



• One of the 276 EU NUTS 2 regions, one of 28 Capital regions, the 2nd richest in Eastern part of the EU - GDP per capita in PPS (35,600 € =129% EU average) - more than all the statistical regions of Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland, Slovenia, Croatia, Cyprus, Malta and the Baltic countries, but also more than Berlin, Attica, Comunidad de Madrid, Lazio, Metropolitan Area of Lisbon.*








