Anna Krzyżanowska-Orlik



Anna is a public policy expert. She manages implementation of the urban policy issues on the regional level (NUT-2). During her career at the local level, for over 8 year she had participated in numerous projects as well as managed network-based European projects (URBACT, Central Europe) aiming at sustainable development of urban areas with participation of a wide spectrum of international, national and regional stakeholders.

Anna was leading the Regional Operational Programme preparation and negotiation process for the Lubelskie Region in Poland in the perspective 2014-2020. She has also a strong experience in urban development processes and its programming within the European standards. She was a creator and a leader of the Integrated Territorial Investments (ITIs) preparation for Lubelskie ROP 2014-2020. Under 2007-2013 programming period of EU funds, Anna was responsible for preliminary assessment of financing for major projects within EU definition. Anna has also strong capacity proven with her career record on communication activities and gathering stakeholders around common goals. For several years she has also worked as English translator and interpreter.

institutions, support measures, transfer of knowledge and technology, the increase in (youth) employment, economic development based on new technologies, the development of creative industries and city's ICT infrastructure.

City of Łódź, Poland

City of Łódź is the capital area of the agglomeration, which has 1.1 million inhabits. Łódź is the third most populated metropolis in Poland. The number of inhabitants in Łódź is 706,000, the budget for the joint investments in the new financing perspective is 2014-2020 is EUR 217 milion. Łódź is the City of students with 22 universities, the City which organizes 60 festivals per year. City of Łódz is the City of Creative Industries. City of Łodź is the Polish candidate for bid to the International EXPO 2022.

Lubelskie Voivodship, Poland

The Lubelskie Region is located on the eastern EU border with Ukraine and Belarus. It is one of the assets of the Lubelskie Region - a place friendly to investors, willing to act in the neighborhood of eastern markets.

Lublin – the capital of the Lubelskie Region with four universities, a technical university and a few private higher education schools is one of the biggest academic centres in the country - every fourth citizen is a student. It is worth mentioning that the offers of the Lublin universities encourage thousands of young people from the Ukraine, Belarus, Kazakhstan and the Commonwealth of Independent States.

The economy of the region is based on agriculture - the Lubelskie Region with its good soil and climate conditions is a national leader of numerous agriculture and horticulture cultivations. Important industry roles are played also by the following sectors: construction, timber and furniture sector, hard coal mining and machinery sector- with production of helicopters, tractors, agriculture and construction machines.

The Lubelskie Region is an attractive area for tourists who like active rest, there are thousands of kilometers of marked walking trails, cycle and horse riding routes and numerous nature trails in national and landscape parks.

City of Rijeka, Croatia

Rijeka is the biggest Croatian harbour on the northern part of Adriatic Sea. The city is the seat of Primorje-Gorski Kotar County and has around 128.000 inhabitants on the area of 44 km2. As a former industrial city, in its Development Strategy set in 2013 for 2014-2020 Rijeka has prioritised the Rijeka traffic route and urban tourism, as well as the development of a competitive economy based on the society of knowledge. The City has been implementing various <u>measured measures</u> since 2008 aimed at strengthening the economy and employment.





Lubuskie Region, Poland

Lubuskie is a region located in the heart of Europe, alongside the Polish - German border and situated about 100 km from Berlin. It is not only a great place for relaxation and recreation, but also a region with a large variety of industrial production with consumers mainly in from Europe, and also in from other continents of the world.

There are over a million inhabitants living on almost 14 thousand square kilometers, which makes the population density in the Lubuskie Region one of the lowest in the country with 72 people per 1 km². Marshal of the Voivodeship in Zielona Góra and the Voivode of the Lubuskie Voivodeship in Gorzów Wielkopolski have their offices in the two biggest cities, the capitals of the region. Strategic East-West transit routes run through the region (Berlin - Moscow) and North-South from Scandinavia to the Balkans.

Pomorskie Region – Lębork, Poland

Contemporary Lębork has got a population of approx. 35,000. It is a city friendly to its inhabitants and visitors, a cosy one, with a unique atmosphere and its own traditions but at the same time open to the future. Many important and prestigious prizes granted to the Municipality Lębork include the European Diploma received in 2006 and the European Flag of Honour granted to Lębork in 2009 by the Council of Europe in Strasbourg in recognition of the international cooperation with foreign partners. Lębork has been modernized and various initiatives aiming at environment protection are carried out. The spatial and economic development of the town concentrate on its east edge, Lębork-East covering about 100 ha. The area has been intended for the development of business, residential building and services. Lębork keeps changing and developing.

Bucharest-Ilfov Region, Romania

Bucharest-Ilfov, the smallest but the most developed and the most urbanised region in Romania, with a population of 2.2 million inhabitants is nost just an attraction for tourists, but a starting point for many of the tourist attraction in the country. You will find plenty of interesting places in Bucharest, starting with museums, art galleries as well as modern entertainment centres built during recents years. Bucharest, the Little Paris, offers a large range of attractions, for everyone's taste, regardless of age group. It is also the most dynamic region from Romania in terms of FDI.

City of Maastricht, The Netherlands

Maastricht is an international city - with 120,000 inhabitants - offering many opportunities. The city is located in the Meuse-Rhine Euregion, close to international cities such as Aachen, Düsseldorf, Liège, Brussels and Antwerp. The diversity of European culture is clearly visible in Maastricht. It is for good reason that Maastricht stood at the cradle of the European Union in 1992 at the time of the signing of the Maastricht Treaty - the treaty on European Union.





Aydın Metropolitan Municipality, Turkey

Aydın is a metropolitan city in Turkey's Aegean Region with a population of 1.053.506. The city is located at the heart of the lower valley of Büyük Menderes River at a commanding position for the region extending from the uplands of the valley down to the seacoast. Aydın's main economy is based on agricutire, tourism and industry, the land is famous for its fertility and productivity since ancient times. The province's best-known crop is figs, other agricultural products are also grown intensively and the city has some light industry.

At the crossroads of a busy transport network of several types, a six-lane motorway connects Aydın to İzmir, Turkey's second port, and to the International Adnan Menderes Airport. The region of Aydın also pioneered the introduction of railways into Turkey in the 19th century and still has the densest railroad network. The province of Aydın has a number of internationally known historic sites and centers of tourism. The weather is hot in summer, and warm all year round.

Aydın also has the distinction of being the first metropolitan city in Turkey administered by a female mayor, Mrs. Özlem Çerçioğlu elected in 2009 and 2014.
