The European Commission proposal for the next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) was published on 2 May 2018. The new MFF has a strong health dimension: health policies will be funded both through dedicated funding as well as through research (Horizon Europe Programme), digital market (Digital Europe Programme), and regional and cohesion funds (Cohesion and Values Programmes) increasing the impact of health policies and support innovative medical and digital health technologies.

SUPPORT DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION OF THE HEALTHCARE SECTOR "Life expectancy in the European Union continues to increase and recently exceeded 80 years, while at the same time birth rate is consistently decreasing.

Of people aged 65 or older in the EU, 80% have at least one chronic disease, representing 70% to 80% of health care budgets, an estimated whopping €700 billion per year!

Given the scale and unfavourable trend, this requires urgent attention.

Digital transformation is certainly going to play an important role as it not only revolutionises diagnosis and treatment, broadens access to care and helps overcome resources constraints, but also enables a shift to prevention and outcome based care."
